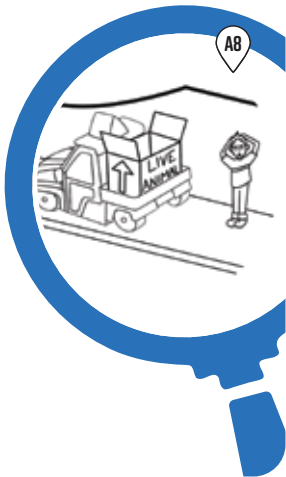
It's a good thing BYU recently launched its Cougar Dash service! There's no better way to get a big cat delivered in 15 minutes (or your money back).
