

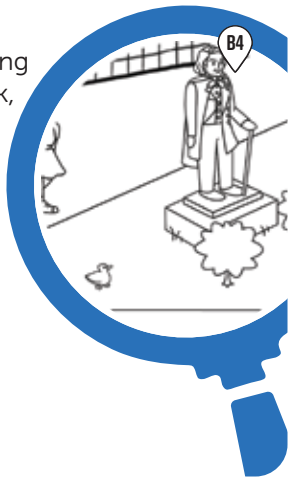
1. THE INTRODUCKTION
